Dr. Mayloemrojo El Bey, known tribally as Ma'at Kare Mut Nepthys, is Chief of Ma'at American Aborigine Tribal Nation, which has its roots and beginnings in The Universal Ma'at, still in existence. Dr. Maylo, or Chief Maylo, to which she is most commonly referred, is a retired Educator, both in the private and public sector. She has worked for 20 years with students ages 7 to 70, teaching just about any subject from chemistry to computers, in addition to Math, English, and Business.

Dr. Maylo holds a B.A. in English with a minor in Chemistry, an M.A. in Education, and a PhD in Theology and Biblical Counseling. She will tell you that she is not religious, and that her spiritual knowledge and beliefs have evolved greatly over the many, many decades of her life. She is a published author of 16 titles; some of them under her current name, but most of them under Elizabeth James or E.A. James. Her experience is diverse and extensive. She has worked for major corporations and in all levels of government. She has been a business owner for 24 years, providing business and education consulting, and tax accounting. She is the President/CEO of Heritage Education Land Prosperity Center (H.E.L.P.) Center, Inc. and is the creator and administrator/director of two 508c1a nonprofits: Ma'at Indigenous Nations' Trust and Body Mind Spirit Healing Center.

Dr. Maylo has served on several community committees and has provided Adult Education and rental/utility assistance through grants received from the Arizona Department of Education and the United Way. Her heart and initial mission lies in helping the Melanated/Coppertone Indigenous People claim everything that has been taken away from them. This includes their history, their land and resources, their culture, their names and identity, their minds, and their heirs. The other part of her mission lies in bringing into fruition The Universal Ma'at's motto: "Healing the planet through many voices with one rhythm and one heartbeat."
